### **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – Brian Harrington**

Our thoughts and prayers are with the families who've suffered from the Hurricane Helene disaster. It was only a matter of a few hundred miles that separated the fortunate from the victims, and it's not difficult to envision a similar situation unfolding right here. I encourage you to provide whatever assistance you can to these people during their time of most urgent need.



**Legal Review--**For years, our membership has expressed the need for professional legal assistance as OILA has struggled to clearly define its legal relationship with Okaloosa County's Government. In the past, there have been calls to fight against the county on various issues ranging from new construction projects, code enforcement complaints, short term rentals, reconfiguration of Santa Rosa Boulevard, and other potential infringements on both private property and protected public lands. Additional legal complexities arise as island residents have suggested modification to, or abolishment of the island's Protective Covenants and Restrictions. All of these issues underscore the need for professional legal counsel.

As a result of your concerns, last year our membership voted to retain the services of Moorhead Law Group based in Pensacola. Over the past year, our attorneys have provided a review of the Island's Protective Covenants and Restrictions and determined that they remain valid and enforceable. Moorhead Law has determined that OILA is not subject to the threat of dissolution due to the Marketable Records Title Act (MRTA). Moorhead Law partners have facilitated the establishment of rapport between OILA and the office of the County Attorney. Both OILA's and the interests of the county are aligned with regard to a case involving short-term rentals in the island's single-family home zone.

OILA has received an impressive amount of legal advice from Moorhead Law Group and that assistance has been provided to us at a very low cost. However, our counsel's annual contract is due for renewal and that is why I'll be asking you to vote to retain them for another year during our membership meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### THIS MONTH IN HISTORY - OCTOBER

October 1, 1908 - Henry Ford's Model T, a "universal car" designed for the masses, went on sale for the first time.

October 6, 1927 - The first "talkie" opened in New York. *The Jazz Singer* starring Al Jolson was the first full-length feature film using spoken dialogue.

October 8, 1918 - During World War I in the Argonne Forest in France, U.S. Sergeant Alvin C. York singlehandedly took out a German machine-gun battalion, killing over a dozen and capturing 132.

October 10, 1913: The Panama Canal officially joined the Atlantic Ocean to the Pacific Ocean when the Gamboa dike was demolished with charges of dynamite.

October 10, 680 Al-Hussein (Al-Husayn ibn) and his followers killed at Karbala by army of Yazid, the Umayyad caliph, on the way to Kufa. His death led to the Shia and Sunni schism in Islam.

October 12, 1492 – Columbus landed in present day Bahamas.

October 16, 1978 - Cardinal Karol Wojtyla of Poland was elected Pope. He was the first non-Italian Pope chosen in 456 years and took the name John Paul II.

October 17, 1931: Scarface Al Capone well known gangster is found guilty of income tax evasion. One week later he was sentenced to 11 years in prison and a fine of \$50,000.

October 18, 1867 – For the purchase price of \$7.2 million the U.S. took possession of Alaska from Russia

October 24, 1940: Due to the passing of the Fair Labor Standards Act in 1938, the 40-hour working week goes into effect.

October 26, 1881: The gunfight at OK Corral occurs. Wyatt Earp, his two brothers, and "Doc" Holliday, have a shootout with the Ike Clanton gang



### ANOTHER BLAST FROM THE PAST: THE FIRST BRIDGE **BETWEEN DESTIN AND FORT** WALTON BEACH

Photo to the left: The East Pass Bridge connecting Destin to Fort Walton Beach under construction in July,1933. The bridge was completed in 1935.

The East Pass Bridge was 3,210 feet long and was completed in April 1935 at a cost of \$324,656 according to the records of the State Road Department of Florida. The federal government paid \$208,415 of the cost, while the state of Florida paid \$116,240.

The present-day bridge (Marler) was built in 1974.

#### UPDATE ON THE BRIDGE-TO-BRIDGE MULTI-USE PATH ON THE SLAND



Construction is Under Way for the Multi-Use Path

Local real estate developer Jay Odom has donated \$50,000 to help facilitate the project. Thank you, Mr. Odom.

The Board of County Commissioners approved a change order for \$525,915 in the contract with the project's developer, C.W. Roberts, that will add 76 days to the project's timeline.



Four main issues caused the project's completion delay. The first is a delay in delivery of the bioluminescent stones used in the path to facilitate night use. Other problems include additional stabilization of the crushed stone in the project to avoid an AT&T fiber line, an extra survey because of a lack of control points on Eglin property, and the relocation of the "Gulf Islands National Seashore" sign because of wetland constraints.
