MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – Brian Harrington

Wild Weather—Okaloosa Islanders are no strangers to severe weather. April is here and it has already brought some ferocious weather to the island. We've been heavy thunderstorm warnings and tornado watches over the last two weeks. This year's hurricane prediction comes in with a 35% chance of a major hurricane coming within 50 miles of Florida—now is the time to review or develop your response plan.



Spring Break—As of this writing, the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office has issued nearly 500 citations for underage possession of alcohol during Spring Break 2025. Until April 20th, the Sheriff's Office has tripled the number of deputies on duty, dedicating them specifically to spring break patrol, with officers working extended hours on both the beach and surrounding areas. Over the break we've seen an increase in vehicle break-in attempts. As a reminder—lock your vehicle and don't leave anything of value in sight including sunglasses, wallets, or spare keys. Oftentimes handguns are stolen from the glove boxes of unlocked vehicles and potentially used to commit crimes.

New Deputy County Administrator Position--The Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved Jason Autrey as the new Deputy County Administrator for Development Services on April 1. The newly established position, approved by commissioners in February as part of an organizational restructuring, will oversee the county's Growth Management, Public Works, and Water and Sewer departments.

Public Beaches— Our neighbors in Walton County just advanced Senate Bill 1622. If passed, this legislation would restore public beach access in Walton County, where conflicts between beachfront property owners and visitors have escalated following a 2018 law that privatized large stretches of previously public beaches. In keeping with our By-Laws, OILA will always strive to preserve the public lands on Okaloosa Island and keep our beaches open to the public for everyone to enjoy.

HISTORICAL FACTS CRAWLER ABOUT OKALOOSA ISLAND

In **1953**, by special act of the Florida Legislature, the Okaloosa Island Authority was created as an instrumentality of the County and vested with administrative authority over the portion of the Santa Rosa Island owned by the County.

In **1975**, legislation was passed by the State of Florida which abolished the Okaloosa Island Authority and transferred the duties and responsibilities of the Authority to the County Commissioners of Okaloosa County.

In **1995**, the County Commissioners approved allowing leaseholders to obtain fee simple title to their property. Island residents & Association members Sam and Joyce Hester were the first individuals to receive quit claim deeds to Okaloosa Island property.

- 2. Email the completed ARC application file to the OILA ARC for review at OILAARC@yahoo.com.

The ARC applications will be reviewed in the order they are received and the review will be completed within 2 weeks of a completed application. (Note: The ARC no longer holds meetings in-person/zoom meetings the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month).

3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes

4. Treasury Report (Jim Simpson) (see attachment 1)

- Discussion on fees for the legal discretionary fund.

- Flood Zone Construction:
 - Sheds and other structures in flood zones require county approval for elevation compliance.
 - o Setback for pools on the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW) is 25 feet (federally regulated).
 - o Fences: No county permit needed unless using concrete columns; wood and vinyl require ARC approval.
 - Sheds under 200 sq. ft.: Must be within 5 feet of property lines.
- Road & Sewer Work:
 - Sailfish Drive paving scheduled for next week.
 - o Sewer lines to be reinforced with new lining.
 - P-Streets scheduled for repaving in the fall.
- Website Team: Regulations to be added to the website under the Regulations tab.

9. Lift Station & Utility Updates

- Lift Station 38 at Beach Access Four has been rebuilt.
- Main lift station near FUBAR has also been rebuilt.

10. Code Enforcement & Short-Term Rentals

- Order of dismissal issued by Judge John Brown due to plaintiff's absence.
- Moorehead Law Group confirmed code enforcement will proceed with restrictions against short-term rentals.
- Discussion on tracking past code enforcement cases to evaluate county success, especially for serious violations.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY - APRIL

The Romans gave the month the Latin name **Aprillis.** but the derivation of this name is uncertain. The traditional etymology is from the verb *aperire*, "to open", in allusion to its being the season when trees and flowers begin to "open".

April 1, 1976: Steve Wozniak and Steve Jobs founded Apple Computer.

April 2, 1513 - Spanish explorer Ponce De Leon sighted Florida and claimed it for the Spanish Crown after landing at the site of present-day St. Augustine, now the oldest city in the continental U.S.

April 3, 1887 - The first woman mayor was elected in the U.S. as Susanna M. Salter became mayor of Argonia, Kansas.

April 7, 1927: U.S. Secretary of Commerce Herbert Hoover's Washington speech was seen and heard in New York in the first long-distance television broadcast.

April 21, 1910: Samuel Clements (Mark Twain), author of Huckleberry Finn, died at the age of 74.

April 14, 1828 - The first dictionary of American English was published by Noah Webster as the *American Dictionary* of the English Language.

April 25, 1901: New York became the first state to require license plates on cars.

April 26, 1789: Fletcher Christian led the mutiny aboard the British ship Bounty against Captain William Bligh.

April 27, 1865 - On the Mississippi River, the worst steamship disaster in U.S. History occurred as an explosion aboard the *Sultana* killed nearly 2,000 passengers, mostly Union soldiers who had been prisoners of war and were returning home.


