MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT – David Hancock

A lot of positive things have happened in the last month for Okaloosa Island. This year we are off to a great start

FDOT Rejects Wright Parkway Option: Everyone deserves a pat on the back for FDOT's decision to not recommend the Wright Parkway Option for further study in the Santa Rosa Sound Alternate Crossing Study. Participating in the study groups, networking, meetings, letters, protests, etc. had the desired effect! See the FDOT Corridor Evaluation Summary dated September 20, 2016 on page 4 of this newsletter for Alternate 1 (the Wright Parkway route) and note the big red X posted next to "NO" on the "Recommended for Further Analysis" option.

Wild Willies approved by the County Commission: The Okaloosa County Commission approved the Wild Willie expansion to the fish hatchery property on Okaloosa Island. At the September meeting Paul Barcus of Wild Willie's showed OILA what a quality development this will be.

Move the NO WAKE Sign in Santa Rosa Sound: Remember at the last meeting OILA unanimously passed a resolution to move the NO WAKE sign in Santa Rosa Sound to the west of the residential property on Okaloosa Island. Since the last meeting have contacted Mayor Mike Anderson and City Council member Amy Jamieson of FWB for the city's support. OILA has been invited to the 10/25 city council meeting to ask for a resolution supporting this idea. Mr. Anderson and Ms. Jamieson both are supporters.

Beach Access Way Restrooms: At the last meeting we selected the Portable Modular restroom concept as something that is affordable for the Okaloosa island Beach Access Ways. Sent this to the TDC; Mr. Darrell Jone – who was the first TDC Director – is now working with Okaloosa Public Works to find this affordable solution. We are fortunate here that Mr. Jones was with the TDC when the first two access way facilities were built: he now wants to finish the job. His message to the Public Works was "sharpen your pencils".

Bridge to Bridge Pathwway: Okaloosa County's budget for FY 2017 was approved with funds for the survey and environmental study included. Public Works will do the project management for these two tasks.



FDOT REJECTS WRIGHT PARKWAY OPTION: Following is the FDOT Santa Rosa Sound Alternate Crossing Summary dated Sept 20, 2016 Which Documents the FDOT Recommendation **to Not Consider Alternate Corridor 1** (the Wright Parkway Route) for Further Analysis.









ALTERNATIVE 1

Advantages

- Lowest potential for non-residential
- Lowest impact to special populations
- Lowest impact to community facilities
- Minimal aesthetic impacts
- Lowest impact to historical and archaeological resources
- Lowest impact to parks and recreation sites
- Lowest number of potential contamination sites
- Lowest construction cost
- Best in terms of overall environmental analysis

Disadvantages

- · Worst in providing system-to-system linkage
- Worst in providing effective emergency evacuation
- •Highest potential for residential displacements
- Only alternative with potential impacts to beach accesses
- Highest impact to floodplains
- •Highest impact to Gulf Islands National Seashore

Presentation: Mr. Paul Barcus, representing Wild Willies Adventure Zone, gave a presentation of their development plans to expand Wild Willies if Okaloosa County approves their assumption of the Aquagreen (fish hatchery) lease.

A motion was made, seconded and approved to reimburse Jim Simpson at total of \$298.62 for stamps to mail the July/August 2016 newsletter (\$20.68), the September 2016 newsletter (\$20.68) and stamps/supplies to mail the 2016-2017 membership renewal notices (\$257.26).

Committee Reports

Membership: Jim Simpson reported a current membership of 249.

MSBU: Paula Hudson reported that the Island Street Light MSBU balance at the end of June was **\$234,593.94** and the balance as of Sept 1 was **\$239,540.86**

Webmaster: Bob Seitz advised that he negotiated for and has implemented a new OILA website program which is better, more flexible and cheaper. .

Boat Basin: Cathy Taylor advised that she transferring her secretary/treasurer duties for the Okaloosa Island Boat Basin Committee (OILABC) to Carol Edlund. She also reported that the OILABC had paid the annual lease fee to Okaloosa County and had approximately \$35,000 in the treasury. In addition, she announced the following newly elected OILABCofficers::

President: Dr.George Edlund Vice-President: Michael Schrader Dock Master. Dan Howell Sec/Treasurer. Carol Edlund

Old Business:

Bridge to Bridge Pathway: Dave Hancock advised that funding for the Bridge to Bridge Pathway was still in the budget and that the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners will adopt the final budget for 2016-2017 on Sept 14, 2016.

New Business:

Focus Group For Improvements on Okaloosa Island: Jim Hendricks recommended establishing a Focus Group to make recommendations and suggestions for improving Okaloosa Island. All agreed that this was needed. Jim Simpson advised that he would put an article in the October 2016 OIL Lantern advising of this concept and would identify Jim Hendricks as the contact person/clearing house for suggestions. The article will include Jim Hendrick's contact information.

OILA Position on the Status of the Aquagreen Lease: The land lease for the Aquagreen (aka fish hatchery) is available since the Aquagreen development will not take place. Earlier in the September 12 meeting a presentation was made by Mr. Barcus of Wild Willies of their intent to have the Aquagreen lease transferred to them for additional development as he presented. With respect to future of this lease, a motion was made, seconded and approved to send a letter to the Okaloosa County Commissioners stating that while OILA is not opposed to the proposed Wild Willies development (as presented) of this parcel, we do take the position that this lease should be rebid (not transferred) thereby giving all interested parties an opportunity to compete. Note: David and Rebecca Sherry voted against this motion.

Beach Access Way Improvements: Dave Hancock advised that due to the requirement to install permanent structure bathrooms in the 3 beach accesses budgeted for improvement, the cost has dramatically increased and has caused a budget shortfall in the start of construction. The permanent structure code would require the bathroom to be 17 feet off the ground. Dave proposed presenting to the TDC the possibility of utilizing a portable, modular building for the bathrooms and showed a photo of what one would look like. The portable would cost \$50,000 (vs \$700,000 for the permanent structure), would be rated for 150 mph winds and have two toilets and a sink and would be hooked into the existing sewer system. Dave plans to present this concept to Growth Management and get feed back. No OILA action is required.

Relocating Minimum Wake Signs in Santa Rosa Sound: Due to wake damage of boats, docks and property on the Okaloosa Island single family residential area fronting Santa Rosa Sound, a motion was made to expand the "minimum wake Zone" from Brooks Bridge west to protect the residential properties fronting Santa Rosa Sound. This would expand the existing "minimum wake" zone approximately 1.5 miles to the west (covering the entire residential area). The motion was second and approved.

Proposal to Hold October 10 OILA Meeting at AJ's Oyster Shanty: A motion was made to hold the October 10 OILA meeting at AJ's Oyster Shanty as a combination met and greet, social hour and business meeting and to allocate \$225 in funds for the purchase of soft drinks/finger food. Any alcohol would be "buy your own". The greet and meet will start at 5:30 pm, the social hour will start at 6:00 pm and the business meeting will start at 7:00 pm. The motion was seconded and approved.

Recommendation for Christmas Caroling and Decorating: A proposal was made for OILA to sponsor Christmas caroling and home decorations (with prizes) for the Christmas season. OILA member Tripp Tolbert generously agreed to donate \$500 for the costs (including prizes) for this effort. Thank you Tripp! Volunteers have agreed to finalize plans and present them at the October 10 meeting.

Adjournment: Meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.
